Golf tournament helps cancer patients at Phoenix Children's

*The Bob Blesch and Carl Wortley III Golf Classic
raises nearly \$40,000 for Hospital's Camp Rainbow*

PHOENIX, Ariz. (Oct. 30, 2007) – The Bob Blesch & Carl Wortley, III Memorial Golf Classic raised nearly \$40,000. All proceeds benefited Camp Rainbow, a summer camp for children with cancer that is sponsored by Phoenix Children's Hospital.

The tournament, held October 25, was sponsored by Arizona Public Service Company, Roshka Patten & DeWolf, Adelman Germany, and DePasquale & Schmidt. A silent auction and raffle were also part of the day's fun and fundraising. Held at Karsten Golf Course in Tempe, the annual golf tournament honors Bob Blesch, who lost his battle with cancer in 2005.

"Camp Rainbow is such an important part of the healing process for children who have, or have had cancer," said Steve Schnall, vice president, Phoenix Children's Hospital Foundation. "We are so grateful to the organizers of this tournament who are truly making a difference in the lives of these children."

Approximately 130 children attend Camp Rainbow each year, where they fish, go canoeing and ride horses. It's a week of fun and activities that also gives children an opportunity to forge lasting friendships with other children who have gone through the same experience. Physicians and staff members of the Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders at Phoenix Children's attend the camp, and many of the counselors are teenagers and young adults who have also battled cancer.
