

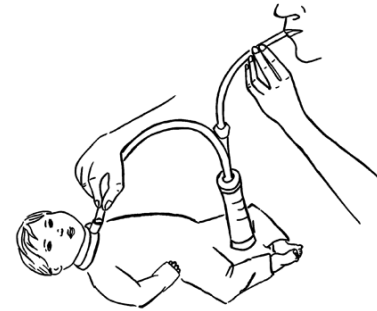

How to Use a DeLee Suction Trap

The DeLee suction trap is made of plastic and can be used in an emergency. It is used when an electrical suction machine is not near or not working.

To use the DeLee suction trap:

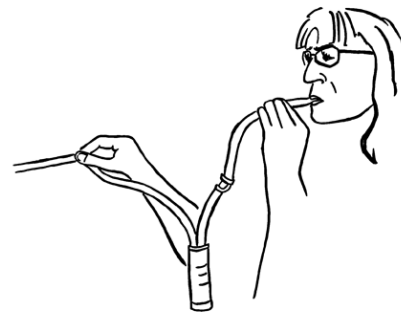
1. Put the tube into the trach.
2. Put the other tube in your mouth, and suck on the tube, like a straw.



Put the tube into the trach.

The mucous goes from the trach into the trap, not into your mouth.

Always carry a DeLee suction trap when traveling with a trach. When you get home, throw out the used DeLee and pack a new one.



Suck on the tube, like a straw.

- Tell your nurse or doctor when you would use a DeLee suction trap. (Check when done.)
- Show your nurse or doctor how you would use a DeLee suction trap. (Check when done.)
